Topic This Term

The topic this term is 'Life Cycles'. We have had caterpillars, and the children have watched them turn into their chrysalis and now we have four beautiful Painted Lady butterflies, which we shall be releasing this week.

The children have planted their own bean plants and watched them grow. Some have been more successful than others, but it has been a great source of hands-on learning. We have had discussions around what plants need to grow and have observed the lifecycle of a bean.

Children will also talk about their own personal daily life cycles e.g., wake up, brush teeth, have breakfast etc It would be great if parents could mirror this conversation with children at home. Why not try and see if your child can include the words, First, Next, Then, After that, Finally, etc when talking about routines.

We have also had discussions about the life cycle of nocturnal animals and were delighted for the children to enjoy a visit from **The Raptor Foundation!** This truly was a memorable experience, and we are pleased to learn that some of the children are still talking about it at home.

Phonics

As you all know we do 1:1 reading here at the nursery. During these sessions we reinforce the phonics taught. We can never over emphasise the importance of reading with your child everyday to get them into a healthy reading culture. There will be times of course where you may not be able to fulfil this request, but even if you are not able to physically sit with your child and read, it is still of much value to give them a book to have a look at. They will begin to independently notice sounds and words they have learnt at the nursery and will be able to begin to anticipate the next part of the story using the illustrations, which is all a very valuable part of the reading process. We ask that you continue to look after the nursery phonics books so that all children are able to enjoy. If you do not return a nursery book, we cannot issue you another one until returned. Please remember that we have signed up to Oxford Owl which has a fantastic collection of phonics books that you can read with your child alongside the books given at the nursery. Please remember that we teach the 'pure sounds'. For example, 's' would be 'sss' and not 'ser' etc. The following link includes a video that teaches you the pure sounds. What is Letters and Sounds? - Oxford Owl for Home We continue to learn how to segment and blend simple two and three lettered words such as, at, an, as, it, in, sat, pat, pin, tin, etc. We also teach phase 1-5 Tricky Words. Each child is awarded a certificate as they work through the phases. Please do not be alarmed if your child has not yet received a certificate, we have a variety of children all of different ages and levels of development and there is absolutely no rush, but please rest assured that each child accesses the same opportunities. You can help your child at home with their phonics using your child's tin.

Mathematics: Maths mastery continues to be our focus at the nursery, a deep-rooted appreciation for what each number stands for. Getting a good grasp of numbers 0-10 remains our primary focus. Children will continue to have a handson approach to maths. We are really pleased that almost all children have subscribed to nursery snacks. This is an opportunity for children to prepare their own snack. Much maths and chopping skills are learnt during this activity. Basic addition, subtraction, halving and doubling etc. In addition to this, children are encouraged to try fruits outside of their comfort zone. We adopt a (smell, lick, bite approach) for children who are a little unsure. With peers trying the same fruits at the same time children are often encouraged by themselves to try. During this session we also encourage conversations to extend language, such as the use of adjectives to describe fruit, e.g., juicy, hairy, round, crunchy etc. We have discussions about where in the world the different fruit grow.

Enterances and Exits: At the end of the day we will now be placing each child's belongings outside under the veranda. We hope this will help to calm the end of day rush. We are also in the process of creating two entrences at the beginning of the day, where some children will enter at the front as usual and then the other children at the side of the building. We will keep you updated about this.

Daily Diaries: Please ensure you bring them and <u>put it in your child's blue book bag.</u> We hope the daily diaries are enough to give you a taster of your child's day, but if you have any further queries please feel free to send an email. If you would like to speak to a member of staff in more detail about anything concerning your child then we are now opening up every Friday afternoon as your chance to do this by appointment only, from 3:30pm.

French: We are delighted that Tonton has become a well-loved and cheeky member of nursery now and has helped children to learn some French Vocabulary. Children have learnt basic greetings, colours, numbers 1-10, days of the week and body parts. We are blown away by how much the children have retained and are always so proud to hear reports of them using their French knowledge at home.

Weather Advisory: As the weather begins to get hotter please remember to put suncream in your children's bags alongside the neccessery clothing items such as sunhats and sunglasses. Please note that we do not allow hooped earrings at the nursery as it is a health and safety risk.
